ENDORSEMENT

- [1] The Applicant/Bank brings a motion to appoint a receiver of all the Defendant/corporation's assets.
- [2] Mr. Tamber is a director of the corporate defendant. He asks for an adjournment to retain counsel, Mr. Kenneth Page.
- [3] The Bank opposes the adjournment request on the basis that Mr. Page indicated that he was not retained as of July 9, 2025 and would not access service of materials on behalf of the defendant. While Mr. Tamber indicates that this is true, he says that he is in the process of gathering the funds to retain him.
- [4] There is no prejudice to the bank (that cannot be addressed in costs) in granting a short adjournment to allow the corporation to retain counsel. Indeed, this is the first time the matter has been before the court.

- [5] This matter is adjourned to September 11, 2025. Counsel for the Bank shall book the date via Calendly. This date is marked peremptory on the defendant and shall proceed with or without counsel.
- [6] Costs are reserved to the motions judge. I am not seized.
