## **ENDORSEMENT OF JUSTICE W.D. BLACK:**

[1] The Royal Bank of Canada ("RBC"), brings this application to appoint msi Spergel as receiver (the "Receiver"), of the respondent Pentagon Logistics Inc. (the "Debtor").

- [2] The materials confirm that the debt owed by the Debtor to RBC as of May 28, 2025, stood at CAD \$1,102,635.92, plus USD \$303,533.13, in connection with various credit and lease facilities provided to the Debtor by RBC. RBC obtained security for the facilities, including a general security agreement.
- [3] The Debtor advised RBC on May 21, 2025, that it has no means to pay its debt obligations and that it has ceased operations.
- [4] RBC demanded payment and issued a notice of intention to enforce its security pursuant to subsection 244(1) of the BIA on May 28, 2025.
- [5] On July 15, 2025, the Debtor voluntarily executed and delivered to RBC a consent to the appointment of a receiver.
- [6] I find that in these circumstances, and in the absence of any opposition, it is appropriate to grant the order that RBC seeks, and I have attached a signed copy of that order to this endorsement.
